Pre-assessment:

• Write three facts about the rainforest (see pre-assessment document).

Hook/Provocation:

 Play video song of *David Williams' Rainforest Song* <u>http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=grsx4gAOxlk</u>

Start With What Students Know:

- Students share what they know about the rainforest (oral stories).
- Students create a detailed drawing about the rainforest adding description and labels.
- Add drawings to learning wall.
- Students name words that describe the rainforest (whole group). Write each word on separate post-it notes.
- As a class, organize and classify the words and create a topic web.
- Add web to learning wall (see sample).

Questions & Predictions:

- Students write questions they have about the rainforest and make predictions about the questions. Later, students will add answers found through research (see form).
- Add to learning wall.

Discovery and Inquiry:

- Use multiple resources to investigate student questions (see list of resources).
- Students may add to the topic web and to their questions during this time.
- Students should begin to choose their research topic.

Research:

- Teach research techniques.
- Students research specific topic within the rainforest. In this example, each student chose one rainforest animal and one rainforest plant to research.
- Students conduct research using multiple sources.

Rainforest Model:

- Students take what they have learned about the rainforest and plan and create a model in the classroom.
- Students should use what they know to make animals and plants to correct size, coloring, shape, etc.
- Students add labels to model.
- Write Chinquapin poems about rainforest animals.

Sharing Learning:

- Invite others to visit the rainforest model and students act as guides to share information about the rainforest.
- Visitors view poems, model, learning wall.
