
The Life of Eric Carle

Eric Carle is known for his illustrations which are created by using a collage technique. Carle cuts and layers papers to form the images.

Many of Carle's books have a nature theme. Eric Carle attempts to create books that are beautiful and provide an opportunity for children to learn about the world.
