


Shoot to the Top

The first player to 120 is the winner.





What is Volleyball?

Volleyball is a popular sport that was invented by William Morgan in 1985. To create the game he mixed parts of two different sports - tennis and handball. Volleyball has become a common sport in many schools in our country and also around the world.

Volleyball is played with two teams of six people. The teams stand on opposite sides of a net, which divides a court in half. On both sides, three team members stand in the front row ready to hit a ball back over the net. The other three stand behind them in a back row, ready to bump the ball up to the front row, or over the net, after it is hit to their side by the other team.

In order to win, a team must be the first to score twenty-five points. To get a point a team has to try to hit the ball back in a way that the other team cannot return it before it touches the floor.
