



## Author's Purpose


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
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<b>to entertain</b> (makes you feel happy, sad, scared, etc.)	<b>to teach</b> (facts, new material)	<b>to inform</b> (current events, news, coming attractions, newsletter)	<b>to persuade</b> (the author is trying to change your mind)
to express an opinion (the author is sharing what they believe without trying to change your mind)	<b>to explain</b> (how to; directions)	to communicate (friendly letter, email, texting)	<b>to answer</b> <b>questions</b> (job application, health form)



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







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Pick a passage to read aloud fluently. Share your favorite picture and tell why you like it.
