
Ken found a staghorn coral on his live rock farm in the ocean.


Ken worked with his daughter to cut and grow more and more corals.

Ken took the coral he grew and transplanted six coral colonies to the reef he had explored as a child.


Ken began a group called the Coral Restoration Foundation. These volunteers worked to restore the reefs.

The volunteers work to transplant coral colonies so that they can survive and grow.


