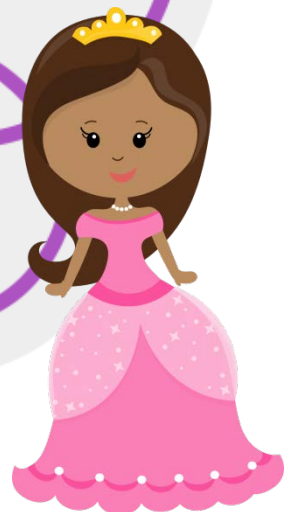
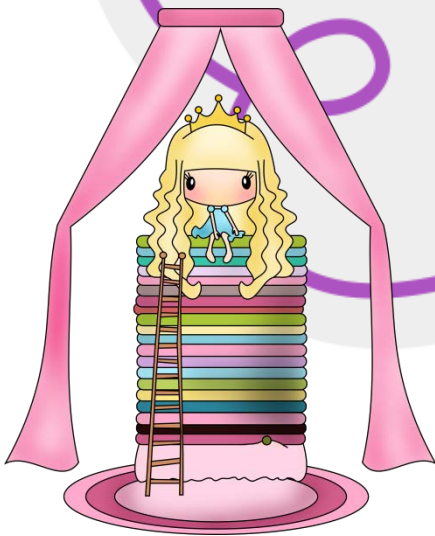
Noticings



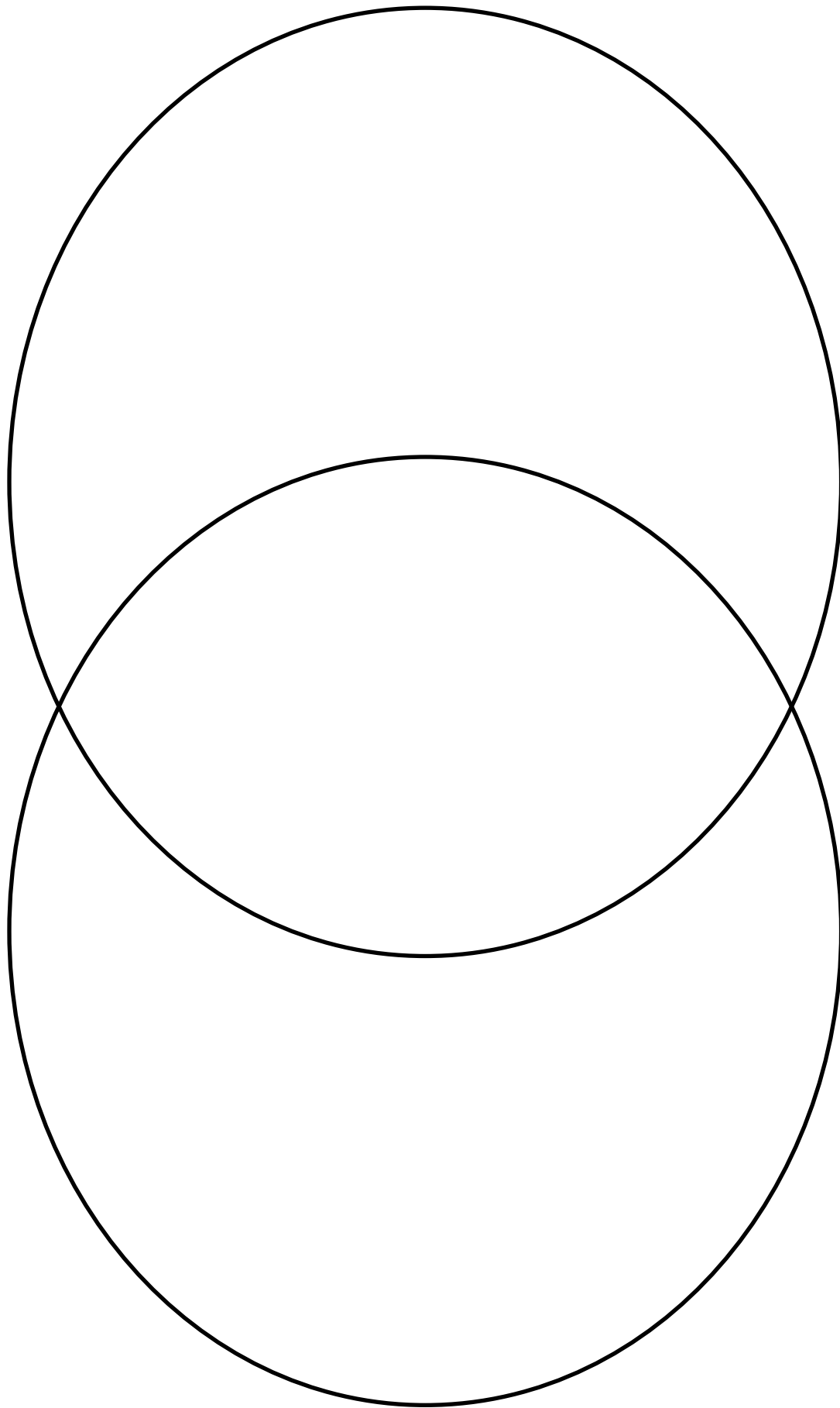
