

polis	the Greek word for a city-state (it was like a state)

Olympics	Ancient Greece athletic competitions held in honor of Zeus
tyrant	a ruler who takes power and rules with absolute authority

column	a tall feature often seen in Greek architecture


demigod	a being in Greek mythology who is part god and part human, Hercules is an example

archaeology	the study of ancient cultures @www.thecurriculumcorner.com






