

one who was killed for a religious belief	an individual who joins the military for profit, an outsider who is not devoted to the cause
a person whose job was to give speeches that entertained and persuade people to accept a belief	Rome's upper-class citizens who ran the government
Rome's lower-class citizens, they rebelled when they were not listened to	lowest class in ancient Rome, a class of Roman citizens who did not own a title or land
to rule as a king or queen	a style of government run by elected leaders chosen by the people
to renounce allegiance to a government or leader	said to be the governing body in the Roman Empire, was meant to cogovern with the Emperor of the Senate

an officer in the ancient Roman military	a sharing of authority or power between three individuals
the ability to prohibit or forbid actions of other officials	during the Roman Republic, these were a country home for the upper class; after fall, many were small farming compounds
