## Early Learning Cognitive Development

- I can point to things as I name them.
- I can count things in a group. (0 to 10)
- I can use my eyes, ears, nose, mouth and fingers to learn about things in my world.
- I can tell about things I see around me.
- I can put things that are the same color in a group.
- I can put things that are almost the same size in a group.
- I can put things that are the same shape in a group.
- I can use the words “more” and “less” to show the difference between two groups of things.
- I can use the words “bigger” and “smaller” to show the difference between two objects.
- I can show that I understand that parts of something put together make a whole thing...like a puzzle.
- I can copy a pattern that I see using beads, blocks or toys.
- I can put things in order by their size.
- I can remember the order of things that I have heard or things that I have done.
- I can show that I understand stories and music by acting them out or talking about them.
